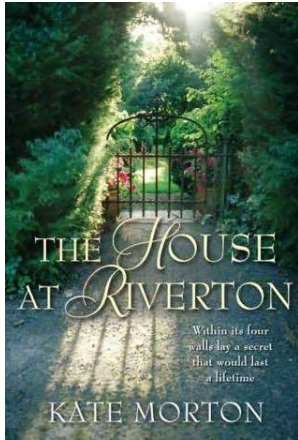


## Summer Reading Senior Book Group Style

Each summer, the Senior Book Group continues to meet for its informal, but informative discussions on excellent books. This summer is no exception.



***The House at Riverton*** by Kate Morton will be discussed on Tuesday, July 20 at 10am at the Milford Senior Center, 60 North Bow Street. A bestseller first published in Australia, then the UK, and now drawing admiring readers in the US. ***The House at Riverton*** is the story of a young domestic, Grace Bradley who at the age of 14, goes to work at Riverton, the stately home of the aristocratic Hartford family. The action begins just before the first World War and continues to Grace's 98th birthday, when finally, so many secrets are revealed about the Hartford sisters Hannah and Emmeline and also, Grace who carried the weight of them for decades. Reviewers have called its brand of romantic suspense reminiscent of Daphne du Maurier.

In August, the group turns their attention to non-fiction with ***Last Call: The Rise and Fall of Prohibition 1920-1933*** by Daniel Okrent. This scholarly, though entertaining, history forms the basis for an upcoming Ken Burns documentary for PBS. Okrent, a former editor for ***Life Magazine*** and the ***New York Times*** is the author of ***Great Fortune: The Epic of Rockefeller Center***, ***Nine Innings: Anatomy of a Baseball Game*** and ***Public Editor # 1***.
