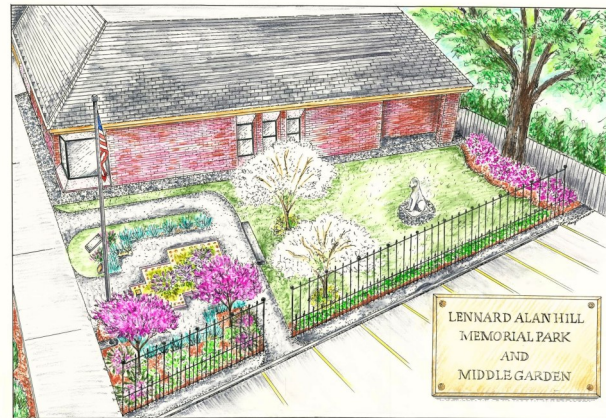

Jeff Snow – *The Softer Side of Celtic*

Wednesday, November 13
at 7:00 p.m.

Jeff is a talented multi-instrumentalist who shares the music and the stories behind the music of Scotland, Ireland and England. Growing up in a home where old Scottish



folk songs were the everyday sounds, Jeff developed an early love for Celtic music. Much of the history of these lands was preserved in song. You will see singing, laughing, lots of smiles and perhaps a few tears as we travel through time. Jeff's music has been described as quiet and relaxing. Much of it is but every once in a while, he breaks out and the foot-stomping begins.

Jeff is a private guitar teacher and the author of the teaching method *Guitar Basics and Beyond*. He was featured in the December 2006 issue of *Acoustic Guitar Magazine* and is a contributing writer for *Acoustic Guitar* and *Autoharp Quarterly* magazines.

Rory Raven – *Brainstorming: An Act of Mentalism!*

at 7:00 p.m.

Brainstorming is an interactive mind-reading show. Minds are read, spoons are bent, volunteers test their own “powers” and, if appropriate, the evening concludes with a re-creation of the kind of manifestation you might have witnessed in a séance chamber over a century ago! While the show is “TV clean”, it is more suitable for adults than children.



A life-long interest in all things psychic and paranormal led Rory to pursue a career as a mentalist and mindbender. His goal is to reproduce the kind of effects parapsychologists have been researching for years – only he wants to do them live and onstage.

Hill Memorial Park and Middle Garden Update

The renovation of the Lennard Alan Hill Memorial Park and Middle Garden is set to begin mid-October. The first phase of the project will include the relocation of the Leo Curran bench and the statue of Dewey; the installation of three new pink granite benches; and the installation of the new pathways in the park and garden.

The remainder of the project - the restoration of the existing benches, Dewey, and memorial plaques; the purchase of the new plantings and the creation of the new flower and plant beds for the new plantings; and the installation of the artificial lawn and decorative fencing - will take place in the spring of 2020.
